

Re-opening of the Whole School for parents

What will it look like at Chandos?

We will be having a staggered re-opening, welcoming back two year groups each day as follows...

This will allow us to welcome back all children over the first two weeks of September.

We will be starting with our oldest children first.

Your child must start on their year group start date, please do not wait until the youngest child's start date to bring back all your children.

Returning to school...

Things to do with your child

Start getting your child back into their school routine... think bedtimes!



If your child is worried about anything about returning, explain to them that there will be people in school they can talk to and let us know on the first day.



Talk to your child about school and explain what will be different.



How will my child enter/leave the school?

Any late children, in the morning, must be brought to the front entrance. They will then be collected by a member of staff in their year group.

We will be contacting our larger families to arrange alternative collection arrangements.

Any late children, in the afternoon, will be taken back to class until 3.30pm. After this, they will be taken to Mr Allan to wait for collection.



Drop off

Any changes to collection, please ring the office by 2:30pm.

Pick up

What will their playtime look like?

Each class will be given their own zone to play in.

There will be a limited amount of equipment for them to use.



At the moment, there will be no snack trolley.

You can need to send your child with a snack if you wish.

What will their lunchtime look like?



Lunchtimes will be very similar to playtimes, with each class having their own zone to play inside with limited equipment.

Children will have 30 minutes in the hall to eat and then 30 minutes outside to play.

Toilets... Will they all go at the same time?

Reception and Nursery will use their usual toilets.

Year 1 and 2 bubbles will have their own toilet labelled in each set of toilets.



Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 bubbles will have their own year group toilets labelled in each set of toilets.

Hand-dryers will not be used, there will be paper towels and a closed bin available instead.

Google Classroom... Are we still using it?

Social distancing...

How will it work in school?

Each child will have a pencil case containing all of their resources so that they don't have to share. Please do not send them in with their own.

Children will be sat in rows facing the front. Children may move seats for different lessons. We will clean down all tables and chairs beforehand.

Corridors are marked with 2m lines and marking on playground to help lining up.



Children will stay within their bubbles and not mix with another.

Social distancing...

How will it work with adults?

Only one parent/family will be allowed in the foyer at any time.

Please wait outside if there is already somebody there.

If a question can be asked to our admin team over the phone, please ring up instead of coming in.

Only one parent/carer will be able drop off/pick up children.

This is to avoid having large groups of people on the playground.



Hygiene... Nothing new!



Regular hand washing is crucial throughout the school day. Time must be allotted for this to happen.

Soap and hot water should be used to wash hands wherever necessary.

Staff should wash their hands at similar timings - approximately six times a day.

Hygiene... Nothing new!



Children should be encouraged to wash hands:

- upon arrival at school
- before/after going to the toilet
- before/after eating
- before/after playtimes

Antibacterial hand gel will also be available in all classrooms and fixed points at main entrances. These should be used by all staff, children and any visiting people as they enter the premises.

Cleaning...

When and how will this take place?

All staff will be asked to maintain a regular
'clean as you go'
strategy in their relevant
working spaces
throughout the day.

A comprehensive site
clean will be completed at
the end of every day as
well as regular day time
cleans.




Every member of staff will
complete a COSHH
Management training.

Each classroom, staffroom
and office space will be
stocked with a blue
'hygiene box' containing
relevant cleaning supplies.

Symptoms...

What happens if someone is showing signs?

Any child or adult within your bubble who begins to show symptoms **must** be taken to the isolation room immediately - the meeting room. They will need to be accompanied by an adult who is wearing PPE and their parent contacted straight away.



All children and adults within that bubble must self isolate for 14 days (7 days for the child showing symptoms) or until that child is tested. A negative test will mean that the bubble can return to school the next working day.

We have a small number of home testing kits which we will give out if necessary.

First aid...

How will this be done safely?

Each room will have a green first aid box in their room.

Where appropriate, children need to be supported to tend to their own needs e.g. wipes, plasters.

Trained first aiders, including pediatrics, on site daily.

Boxes will contain:

- PPE
- Plasters
- Wipes
- Bandages
- Instant ice packs
- Folder to record
- Medication of children

When a child shows symptoms staff must wear PPE while with them.



If you do not have a first aider within your bubble, use the corridor phone to ring the relevant corridor to request they assist.

If you have to break social distancing, wear PPE and work side by side.

Additional emergency first aiders may be trained up - possibly teachers as well as teaching assistants.

Personal Intimate Care...

How will this be done safely?

Every effort should be made to **avoid** intimate care. However this could be unavoidable.

Parents/carers should be called immediately if this happens, to collect their child.

Soiled clothes should be bagged up using PPE and given to the parents upon collection. First aid boxes will contain change of clothes if child does not have any.
